

KARRTABYA has been at the forefront of driving local changes that contribute to the SDGs. With a commitment to fostering an inclusive society where every individual has an identity, independence, and the ability to exercise their rights with dignity and equality—especially works primarily in the domain of Education, Health, Agriculture, Child & Youth Development and Food & Nutrition - KARRTABYA 's vision aligns seamlessly with the overarching vision of the SDGs. With a special focus on women, and children, KARRTABYA has made significant contributions across the Sustainable Development Goals. KARRTABYA is contributing to achieve the goals of SDG, at this point of time we are contributing to 8 Sustainable Development Goals out of 17. By our numbers of programs and project we are contributing to SDG -1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8 & 13.























Intervention

SDG-1 NO POVERTY



- Income Enhancement Initiatives: To boost household incomes, 1130 individuals were supported in securing sustainable livelihoods through skill development programs. Training focused on trades such as fishery, goat rearing, vegetable cultivation, and tailoring.
 - 70 SHG were capacitated on different skills, technique and got exposure on use of new technology. These group members are self-sustained through goat rearing, fishery, petty businesses etc
 - o 781.54 hectors of cultivable land covered under Good Agriculture Practices covering 1345 farmers of 52 villages.
 - Skill development program including hard skills and soft skills training conducted with 153 WSHG on different trade like Fishery, Goatery, Vegetable and tailoring as a result 1130 household additional income enhanced 15k to 25k per annum.
 - o 765 SHG members/women aware on Digital literacy / Financial Literacy
 - 23 livestock vaccination programmes conducted jointly with veterinary department government of Odisha covering 6847goats with 819 HH.
 - o 13 SHGs have been linked with Odisha Livelihood Mission (OLM) and availed INR 34, 10,000 for improved their livelihood through Goat rearing, Patty business and Vegetable cultivation and their monthly additional raise up to 10k to 15k.

• Strengthening Farmer Collectives:

 Strengthening two Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), benefiting 996 farmers with improved market access and services worth ₹0.335 crore.

• Financial support to most vulnerable children:

o Monthly financial support of ₹1000 provided to 65 vulnerable children to meet their basic needs.







The interventions resulted in measurable improvements in household incomes and economic resilience. By equipping individuals with livelihood skills and promoting collective farming practices......

- Enhanced income stability for over 1,100 households.
- Enabled 996 farmers to achieve better market access, reducing dependency on middlemen and increasing profitability.

- Increased household incomes and self-reliance, fostering economic stability in underserved communities.

Impact Story

Jagnyaseni Bag, a tribal woman from Junagarh Kalahandi, has transformed her life and livelihood through financial and digital literacy. As a skilled seamstress, she was earning a modest income of INR 2,500- to 3,000 per month. In FY 2023-24, Jagnyaseni participated in a digital literacy training program organized by KARRTABYA with curiosity and enthusiasm, she learned how to leverage digital platforms like YouTube, Facebook, and WhatsApp to enhance her tailoring skills and business acumen. With the help of YouTube



online tutorials and subscriptions to tailoring channels, Jagnyaseni acquired knowledge of modern designs, trends, and customer preferences. By sharing updates and pictures of her work through WhatsApp, Jagnyaseni established a loyal customer base, built on timely delivery, seamless communication, and exceptional customer service. As a result, her tailoring shop, once limited to alteration and repair services for villagers, has become a goto destination for bespoke clothing. Jagnyaseni's average monthly income has increased to INR 6,500-7,000 per month.

• Rural Creche Initiative (RCI): The RCI supported by Azim Premji Foundation was established to provide comprehensive early childhood care, including health and nutrition, for children in 9 remote villages.

- Households with diversified food production: 45 Awareness generation events on Nutrition management, 3 Hands on trainings on Diversify food baskets and facilitating Propagation of nutrition initiatives handholding support as a result 1045 HH diversified their food basket to minimise the nutrition issues.
- Consumption & Area covered under nutrition rich and bio fortified crops: To provide the nutrition supplement to the community the project support 49 farmers it is covering 18.4 Ha. Paddy cultivation. The speciality of the paddy was bio fortified seeds and aromatic which is more nutritious to complementary nutrient rich food support may minimised the nutritional issue of the community.
- Provided startup and allied support (gotary) to 18 numbers of needy families to improve their livelihood condition. The support has been provided to the single parent families and those who are very poor in economy hoping that they will multiply the resources and fulfil their need.

Impact Story

Gayatri, a 11 years old single parent child lives with her 3 siblings and mother in a small village of Kalahandi, Odisha. Her father passed away in the year 2012 due to cancer when Gayatri was only one month old. After death of her father (Ghadiram) family income stopped. There was no one to help them at that time. Gayatri's mother found very difficult to manage the family alone. After that, two elder sisters Pankajini & Subhasini were dropout in 9th and in 6th grade respectively. KARRTABYA who works for child development extended a helping hand towards Gayatri & her family. Gyatri enrolled in 'Alternative Forms of Child Care Project' in 2013. Gayatri received INR.1000 per month; this amount somehow helped Gayatri for fulfil of her health, education & small expenses. After discussion with the mother and based on feasibility KARRTABYA provided INR.15000/- as livelihood support for goat farming in the year 2018. Initially they purchased 2 goats at present they have 9 goats. They sold 5 goats in INR.50000/- and purchased a bicycle for Mohan, brother of Gayatri, II-gram gold and a television for family. Meanwhile they take mud gage 70 decimal land and doing farming and earning around INR.25000/- per annum. The team of KARRTABYA made linkages with the Gram Panchayat for a pucca house; she built a pucca house through Pradhan Mantri Awas Scheme. Their life condition is increasing day by day. Gayatri and her family





thankful to the KARRTABYA to taking them towards a better and happy life.





SDG-3 GOOD HEALTH AND WELBEING

Intervention

Alternative for of Child Care Project supported by Kinderpostzegels extends its health focus to adolescents and caregivers, addressing critical gaps in reproductive health education and preventive care in Junagarh, Jaipatna, Golamunda and Dharamgarh block of Kalahandi district.

- o Capacity building of AWW & ASHA on preschool and services.
- o Regular health awareness engaging over 2080 participants, including pregnant and lactating women.
- o Ensuring community participation in VHNSD.
- o Ensuring immunisation coverage through awareness and community mobilization.
- o Motivating for institutional delivery in tribal & inaccessible area.
- Create awareness on adolescent reproductive health coupled with deworming drives and iron-folic acid supplementation, mensural hygiene and different schemes for the adolescent.
- o Celebration of POSHAN Maah with the adolescent, lactating mother, pregnant mother.
- Meeting and Focus Group discussion with the pregnant, lactating mother on importance of institutional delivery, new born care, maternal care, safe drinking water etc
- Session for adolescent/ children/ Youths on life skills, resilience and supporting them in their mental wellbeing.

- Enhanced access to safe drinking water for 751 households, reducing health risks.
- Improved physical health for children through regular health screenings and nutritional interventions.
- Use sanitary napkin has been increased in the remote villages of Th.Rampur, Jaipatna and Junagarh block.
- Families reported noticeable improvements in children's health and energy levels. Regular intake of nutritious food combated undernourishment and promoted steady physical growth.
- Households gained awareness about balanced diets and the importance of proper nutrition for long-term health benefits.

SDG-4 QUALITY EDUCATION

Intervention

- Access to School: Organized Enrolment Drive Campaign twice at 42 villages tribal villages of Thuamul Rampur block of Kalahandi, 543 children admitted in the school.
- Capacity building of SMC: 600 SMC member of 32 SMC capacitated on their role, responsibility, school governance and RTE-2009.
- Capacity building of Teacher: To make the teaching process more joyful numbers of training organised for the teachers on joyful teaching methods, multilingual education and pedagogy.
- Block level Coordination workshop: In the chairmanship of BDO, Thuamul Rampur, Mr.Dhruba Charan Muduli the workshop organised, where Sarapanch, SMC members, School Teacher, Student, Parents, Civil Society Organisation etc took part and shared the issues related to child education and collective prepared a plan of action for quality education in the block.
- Workshop on Child Rights involving the stakeholders: Conducted workshop on child rights involving the stakeholders at Kaniguma, Thuamul, Badchhatrang, Birikot and Bagdiani Grampanchayats. and discussed on various issues of children including education and taken immediate action against child violation.
- Creating Plat form for children: to create a platform for children, KARRTABYA have



formed 42 numbers of children club. Leadership, value of education, importance of child collectives, club management etc training organised and building their capacity on their rights. In this process children are sitting monthly once and discussing each other on different issues and way to solution and

supporting each other's. This plat form is also to exhibited and express their inner talent, quality etc. Sports, learning and fun materials supported to these child collectives. This year a platform of innovative idea exhibition provided in which 21 innovation and science project such as filtering process of muddy water to drinking water, magic math, project on climate change, food cooling system etc displayed by the children. Meaningful participation ensured through different programs like Children Day, Food Festival etc.

- **Develop library and TLM corner at schools**: In 32 schools of Th.Rampur block, Library and TLM corner developed. The students are easily accessing the books such as story books, novels, Biography of a great men and women, books of General knowledge, poem etc. and TLM for Math and Language for their learning.
- Develop Cadres of Change: 8 local change agents have been identified those who are supporting / teaching the slow learners as well as identifying out of school children and motivating them to back to school. The change agent motivating and bringing back out of school children and irregular student.

Impact



- 316 out of school reenrol in the school.
- Enrolment in school increased, 543 children admitted in the school.
- Increase in retention of student in school
- In 10 schools SMC involvement increased
- Child meaningful participation increased in various activities conducted in school & community.
- In 35% school students enjoyed the new pedagogy methodology of teaching, nature study, children enjoyed the story telling, flax card using and different TLM.
- Children are supporting each other during one's adverse situation

Impact Story

This year KARRTABYA able to bring back 316 out of school children to school. KARRTABYA's staff faced lot of difficulties and obstacles for this achievement. Of course, the support received from parents, teachers, PRI members and SMC was praise worthy. Here we can site one example of Mohan Majhi, an out of school children of a tribal village of Th.Rampur block of Kalahandi, Odisha. In the year 2016 due to family disturbance, Mohan's mother left the family. During that time Mohan and his younger brother Mukesh was studying in residential school manage by Government of Odisha. But the drunker father forced them to stop education and forced both the children for cooking, cow grazing, collecting fire wood etc. Meanwhile father of Mohan got 2nd marriage & both the children were more neglected. The second wife of Hajari Majhi (father of Mohan) often used to beat them when they were not going for work.

In the year 2022, KARRTABYA started working Mohan's village called Dhuliguda, formed child club, more engagement happened with the children. During this process it came to our noticed that that Mohan & Mukesh's are away from school for last 6 years. Ms. Pratima Sunani, staff of KARRTABYA identified and understand root cause of the sorrow story. She visited to Mohan house asked his father to let their sons go to school but he refused to do so. After many visits finally Hajari Majhi motivated, repent of his mistake and allowed both the sons to go to school. Pratima, enrolled Mohan in 8th standard in Kaniguma Highschool in the year 2023. Also, his father enrolled to Mukesh in a residential school in 6th standard. Now Mohan and Mukesh are going to regularly and studying well. They are also active members of Dhuliguda child club.

This is story of two children in this way KARRTABYA abled to bring back 316 students to school.









SDG-5 GENDER EQUALITY

Intervention

- Mass awareness on demerits of child marriage, child labour and gender discrimination conducted in 42 villages through street play.
- Organized session with adolescent girls on consequences of child marriage at 42 villages.
 The objectives of this program was adolescent will know the demerits of early marriage and motivate and help their friends to get marry in right age.
- Involvement of women in farming mostly on decision making process.
- Creating more awareness physical, sexual or psychological violence against women.
- Strengthening adolescent group more capacitating them on SRHR
- Enhancing the use of enabling technology, specially through digital literacy to promote the empowerment of women

- 7 early marriage case stopped / delayed.
- 765 SHG members/women are knew on digital literacy and 45% women are using digital
 / social media for their livelihood and empowerment work.
- More than 1000 adolescent capacitated on SRHR and accessing different schemes and services from the Government.








SDG-6 CLEAN WATER AND SANITATION

- Preparation of water budget in 88 villages of Junagarh, Dharamgarh and Golamunda
 block
- Repairing of hand pumps, it's platform, pipe line extension from solar inbuilt hand pump to households' level etc activities were taken up.
- 38 awareness programs on Drinking Water and Grey Water Management carried out.
- Renovation and construction of 14 water harvesting structures.
- Pond deepening, Land developments, Soil moisture conservation work.
- Promotion of efficient water saving technologies/practices done through role pipe, drip & poly mulching.
- Participatory water management initiatives taken up in 52 villages with the technical support of KARRTABYA. It's included participatory assessment of common resources and creating management plan and crop and water budget plan.

- Improved access to drinking water management in 11 villages covering 751 HHs.
- 5.74746 LCuM water saved / stored by renovating and construction of traditional water bodies available in the community at Dedar, Kutingpadar, Sinakhunti, Dhanpur, Chanchanbahal, Beheraguda, Kotmer, Tekpada, Putiachura, Karmath, Karpa, Dedar and Banjibahal villages. INR 2, 19, 90,049.00 have been leveraged from the local Government for Pond deepening, Land developments, Soil moisture as result in Rabi session farming done by the farmers, house hold income increase by pisciculture done by the SHG mothers.
- Efficient water management done in 19 villages covering 101.02 hectors through drip, poly mulching and role pipe







SDG-8 DECENT WORK AND ECONOMIC GROWTH

Intervention

- Productivity improvement through diversification, new technology, focus on high-value added and labour-intensive work.
- Campaigning on Child Issue such as child Labour and Child Protection: Member of child club did campaign to stop child labour.
- To eradicate child labour and elimination of the worst forms of child labour, KARRTABYA
 created awareness and in community simultaneously trace and track the child labour and
 re enrolled in the school.
- KARRTABYA promoting and supporting micro-, small- and medium-sized enterprises, including through access to financial services.

- House hold income increased by pisciculture, goatary, agriculture, horticulture, small business and tailoring.
- 63 child labour return back to school and 25 linked with skill development training.











SDG-13 CLIMATE ACTION

Intervention

- Villages Initiated Climate Resilience Measures: A total of 27 villages adopted climateresilient practices, demonstrating proactive measures to mitigate climate change effects. These practices included mass awareness generation, integration into village/Gram Panchayat Development Plans, and the promotion of plantation drives. Specifically:
 - 50 mass awareness events on climate resilience and planning processes were conducted.
 - o Four targeted workshops trained stakeholders on climate adaptation measures.
 - o Renovation and construction of water harvesting structures.
 - Participatory water management initiatives in 52 villages, including training sessions and stakeholder workshops.
- Conservation of Common Resources: Soil and moisture conservation activities were conducted in eight villages, covering 139.3 hectares. Techniques such as farm bunding, area treatment, and drainage line treatment helped preserve soil health and boost agricultural sustainability.
- Conducted 250 awareness programs on climate resilience farming practices to address
 the farming issues by climate change production factor. As we covered 819.296 hectors
 for soil fertility improvement, resistant seed, intercrop, trap crops and INM.
- 3000 plantations done in hilly area and conservation by the community.

Impact

These measures have increased community resilience to climate change by:

- Enhancing irrigation reliability and reducing climate vulnerability for farmers.
- Optimized water usage in agriculture, increasing efficiency and reducing wastage.
- Preserving soil health and ensuring sustainable agricultural practices.
- Improved irrigation reliability and agricultural productivity, benefiting farmers.
- Enhanced community resilience to climate variability through sustainable resource management.
- Soil and moisture conservation practices implemented across 139.3 hectares, boosting agricultural sustainability.
